The meeting was called to order by President **Peter N9HDW** at 1930. Introductions were made, with Peter asking members and guests to answer the question: "What mode and/or band of amateur radio operating would you like to try that you have not yet?" The majority of members wanted to try satellite.

Under President's Announcements, Peter covered the following: The next Executive Board meeting will be held 7 p.m. Oct. 26 at his QTH, and that all members are invited, especially those interested in giving input on what the club wants in its repeater service. Chairmen are

needed for the Vehicle Definition Task Force and New Membership. The club truck was sold for \$1,075. Vice President **Bruce K9OZ** and **Mary K9GAL** are absent due to a family emergency.

The Vice President's report was given by Peter in Bruce's place. The next club meeting slated for Nov. 4 will be Show & Tell and auction. In lieu of the usual Christmas Party, there will be a holiday meeting on Dec. 2 First Presbyterian Church of Wheaton, 715 N. Carlton Ave. The Secretary's Report was given by Peter in Mary's place. A new member application was presented for vote by club and accepted. The new member is **William Ponall KA9WLS**, Lee, Illinois, sponsored by **Roberto WA9E**.

Treasurer **Ken N9HQ** gave a report. Custodian Report was given by **Kurt KB9RTO**. The Club truck has been sold and buyer will pick up title and truck on Oct. 25. Club lettering on side of truck will be removed before title transfer. Several club members gathered on Sept. 9 to clear out club gear from the truck in preparation for sale. Kurt said the missing club MFJ analyzer may have been found.

Happy Birthdays this month went out to **John W9LIN**, **Gerald WB9WBN**, and **Steve N9OA**.

Under Public Service, **Joe N9WRO** said First Presbyterian Church of Wheaton is sponsoring a Sleep Out for the Homeless overnight Saturday, Nov. 5 into Sunday morning Nov. 6. The church has requested radio-equipped Watchers to provide perimeter security for the members of the congregation who will be sleeping outside on the church lawn to experience a bit of what it's like to be homeless for a night. Need three persons per shift: 6 to 9 p.m., midnight to 3 a.m., and 3 to 6 a.m. Signup sheet is being passed around, Joe said.

In **Tom N9WBW**'s absence, Peter gave the Web Team report. Team has formed and begun meeting, has procured service through West Host of Utah. Will be establishing update processes so regular postings such as Hamletter can be performed.

Hamfest Chair **John WT9Y** reported that major positions are filled. The next committee meeting will be Nov. 6. A Saturday visit to the site is being arranged. Tickets have been printed but are not present tonight. John will notify people how to get them shortly.

Representing the Repeater Administrative Board, **Larry KA9KDC** said the 220 machine is off the air due to failure. The RAB is investigating. The 2-meter machine okay. 440 machine apparently had a power interruption, but is fine now. Executive Board approved \$300 allocation request for lightning protection gear for the 2m machine.

Motion passed to accept the reports as given.

In general announcements, Ken announced the Club had placed Fourth in ARRL Field Day 2005 contest in 8A with approximately 6,000 points. First place 8A had over 10,000 points.

Old Business: On behalf of the club, Peter presented **Jack KA9HEL** with a plaque in appreciation for his service as Club Treasurer 2003 to 2005.

New Business: Peter presented the 2005 budget the Executive Board had drawn up and approved at the Sept. 21 Executive Board meeting. Approximately \$6,400 in expenses and about the same for income, not including the truck sale proceeds. Motion to confirm and accept the budget presented, by Steve with second by Joe, was passed.

Carol KB9FYL and Larry advocated the RAB request for allocation for the 2m repeater lightning protection gear needed to be approved by the club per the By-Laws, even though the Executive Board had approved it. Peter purported such vote was not required by By-Laws, but to be sure entertained a motion by Joe, seconded by **Marty N9NTM**, to confirm and approve the allocation. The motion passed. Peter invited interested parties to examine current By-Laws at the break, after the club meeting before the program session tonight, to clarify this.

Motion to adjourn passed, and the meeting was adjourned at 2030.

For a monthly magazine, QST has done a great job of timely stories of “behind the scenes” work by ham communicators. Page 43 starts “The Katrina Chronicles” with dramatic photos and narrative of hams in action. Page 49 gives a complete Transcript of ARRL’s President Haynie’s “Message to Congress” on the work done by Emergency Volunteers from the Ham service. Even the cover illustration highlights the “eye of the storm.”

On page 12 the Editors tell their story of how they collected the data. The state section managers played an important role in organizing the relief efforts with the Red Cross and other agencies.

FATHER OF RADIO” CONTROVERSEY GETS HELP

We’ve always considered Marconi as the “Father of Radio”. If you live in Russia, it is a different story. They consider A. S. Popov, a Russian scientist, as “Big Daddy of the Air Waves.” A Page 20 story tells about “Amateur Ambassadors” who have attempted to build a bridge between the two positions on the discovery. How? The self-styled “Ambassadors have presented a “Marconi Pioneer Award” plaque to the new St. Petersburg Museum bearing the Popov name.

ANTENNAS ANYONE?

Page 21 describes a 160 foot tower put up for KG4FRZ in Tennessee. He called in a 22 ton skyhook crane to get it going with five different antennas. (The Wheaton Zoning Board wouldn’t like that height)

If you need a new 2-meter antenna, turn to Page 66 for “Fox Finder”. It comes complete with a handle for aiming at the fox. The parts are all locally available except for the aluminum tubing, which can be ordered from Texas Towers.

For apartment dwellers, MFJ is offering a “balcony/window mount” antenna—see Page 70—that covers from 80 to 6 meters. It is rated at 200 watts.

And if you seek a low profile with your antenna, the page 31 article is for you. It features a “stealth” wire antenna plan. The author gives you five pages of advice on getting top performance out of a “hidden wire.”

Activities on the HF Bands

Kimo Chun, KH7U, and another unnamed radio amateur, are to go to Palmyra on November 5th for two weeks. They will be conducting the annual maintenance and repairs to the island electronics for "The Nature Conservancy". They are also going to install two, BiggIR 6.9 to 54 MHz verticals kindly donated by the NCDXF and SteppIR. Another tower is also to be installed. This is another phase in constructing two amateur HF stations on the island. Though access to these stations may be very limited, it is hoped that it will lead to more and regular operations from this rare DX entity. Palmyra is first a pri-

vately owned (Cooper Island) scientific research station and wildlife sanctuary (the rest of the islets and surrounding waters.) In their spare time they will try to operate one or two stations on SSB/CW/RTTY. It is not known if operations on 80/160 will be made. It may not be possible to take or erect an antenna on this trip. Please QSL via published QSL Managers for the respective operator or by their direction on the air. KH7U/KH5 is via AH6NF.

A multi-national team is heading to Malyj Vysotskij Island (MV Island) during mid to late November, including the CQ World Wide CW DX Contest. They expect to land on November 15th and will set up equipment for 10-160 meters and 2 meters scatter. They will not be QRV on 6 meters as their license does not include 50 MHz. Activity will be on CW, SSB, RTTY and PSK31. Before the CW WW CW, they will be QRV as R1MVW. During the Contest they will operate as R1MVC in the multi-multi category. This will be the first time ever an operation has taken place from MVI during the CQ WW CW.

For equipment they will be using three FT1000MPs, three TS850SATs, two 1.5 KW amps and two 1KW amps. Four generators will be used. For antennas they will be using a 25 meter high Inverted L on 160 meters, multi band (30-160) vertical for 80 meters (20 meters high), quads for 12, 17, 15, 20, 30 and 40 meters and a 5 element yagi for 10 meters. Team members will include: DL3DXX, DL5LYM, IW9BBX, LA8AJA, LA9VDA, OH5LID, OH5NE, RA1AR, RA2FW, RA6LBS, RK3FA, RN9XA, RU1AS, RV1CC, RV1AC, RV2FW/1 (team leader), RX1CQ, RX1AX, UA2FB, UA2FF, UA2FM, UA2FZ and UA9XC. The sponsors for this DXpedition are NCDXF and R-Quad (antennas and towers). The team plans to have a Web page at <http://www.r1mvi.com/>. It is currently under construction.

They are still looking for additional support. Anyone donating 100\$ will be listed on the QSL card. Also a special color QSL will be available for anyone donating \$5 with their QSL card. QSL info is via DK4VW for direct cards or via the UA2 QSL bureau.

The "Worldwide Antarctic Program" (WAP) has announced that the 3rd Antarctic Activity Week will be held February 20-26th, 2006. The AAW is a way to highlight worldwide interest in the Antarctica as a land of study, research and peace, with its main objective as knowing more about the icy Continent, as well as to share and promote initiatives among Hams, Antarctic hunters, World- Wide Antarctic enthusiasts and supporters.
