CRAIG FUGATE, FEMA ADMINISTRATOR, REPORTS ON HAM EMERGENCY AID

The FEMA head is quoted—“we get so sophisticated and we have gotten so used to the reliability and resilience in our wireless and our wired and our broadcast industry and all of our public safety communications, that we can never fathom that they'll fail. They do. They have. They will. I think a strong Amateur Radio community [needs to be] plugged into these plans.” On Page 66 QST also tells the story how Ham Radio was of vital help in the Joplin, Missouri, storm. The local repeater took the place of cell phones that were overloaded and mostly non-existent. The MESN (Missouri Emergency Services Net) was up for nearly 24 hours after the storm hit. Ham Operators assisted both the American Red Cross and SATERN and logged over 2000 hours during the week that followed the disaster.




