### **RECORD-SETTING CROWD VISITS MECCA OF HAM RADIO IN LARGE NUMBERS**

Nearly 25-thousand hams visited Dayton this year for the ARRL Centennial Year Hamfest celebration, surviving through sunshine, rain and even hail! You can pick up the spirit of the event by reading Becky Schoenfeld's ( QST's Managing Editor) report of the events on pages 65 and 66 of this month's issue. Many photographs record the Award winners and radio celebrities. The actual birth-date (May 18th) fell on the last date of the convention, so the theme of the final event was "Happy Birthday" with cupcakes being passed out to the crowd by the League staff.

### **TAPE MEASURE VERTICAL ANTENNA SHOWS TOOL BOX ITEM IN NEW ROLE**

If you have heard of "Fox Hunting", you've seen the inexpensive beam that can be built from the flexible steel metal tape that coils up after the measurement job. This month's QST article by Glen Thibodeaux, KF5FNP, will surprise and amaze you. He starts with a 25' tape measure and turns it into an antenna that can be adjusted for 15, 17, and 20 meters by adjusting the pull-out length of the tape! Glen provides "how-to" instructions for the antenna which he hangs on a tree limb. Based in Southern Louisiana, Glen gets good signal reports from the Caribbean and Gulf area and finds a perfect companion for "go kit" radios. The article is on pages 33 to 35.

### **LOOKING AT A GIANT FEMA EXERCISE IN THE 49TH STATE**

Rick Palm's Public Service column this month on pages 72-73 is devoted to a report on a major FEMA exercise in conjunction with the 50th Anniversary Celebration of the great earthquake of 1964. The original event was on Good Friday. The column treats the story from the FEMA observer's point of view, as well as the Ham Radio Operator's outlook from Linda Mullen, AD4BL of the Ham Radio Team of Wasilla. The simulated "patient" evacuation was accomplished by Air National Guard C-130 Transport planes.

### **RADIO OPERATOR IS HERO OF FAILED ITALIAN POLAR EXPEDITION**

Not many will remember the cruise of the Italian airship ITALIA to the North Pole in 1927. Mario Marinaro, WN1M, recalls it for us on pages 63 and 64 this month's QST. The 385 foot dirigible crashed during an exploration of the North Pole 184 miles from the nearest base in King's Bay, Spitsbergen. The harrowing tale of Giuseppe Biagi, the ship's radio operator, and his successful radio calls for rescue are an inspiration for those who attempt to "do good works" with their radio skills. Those who made it home from the crash included eight crewman and their mascot, a fox terrier.
